The vision that Mrs. Lou Scott had in 1967 to serve children with special needs continues today with an agency that develops and provides the finest services to over 475 qualified individuals. In the very near future, we will begin construction of a new CTH-II home that will house four females. This home will be located directly behind the King House. We are very excited about this new endeavor and look forward to subsequent residential development to address the needs of our waiting lists.




At DCDSNB we have high standards, goals in place, policies set by our board; and all we have to do is adjust our attitudes and just do the right thing each day. During this 1st quarter, we focused on training. Our residential director provided training in Positive Behavior Supports for residential staff each Tuesday dureing the month of February. Our annual training for all employees was held on March 14-15. Employees were trained on the "revised" Abuse Neglect and Exploitation Policy and proper reporting procedures. They heard from Judith Samuel Jackson and board attorney, Art Justice. They received training on slips, trips and falls from Brooke Russell, ED with the National Safety Countil. Additional training was given on medication administration and bloodborne pathogens by our own Shannon Bennett, RN. We took a break from the training to celebrate over 85 years of loyal services from 12 of our employees.

As executive cirector, I will focus on imporving the quality of training. This will improve the knowledge of procedurees, Ruth Thomas, Executive Director the planning of all actiities and align them with our agency's mission.

have been through many trials and tribulations throughout my life, but thanks to God and my family and friends I have come through them all a better person.

Yes, I have had my down moments, but I focus my energy on staying positive. My parents gave me some of the best advice years ago. They said, "Whitney you have a choice. You can either accept the physical challenge that you have and the path God chose for you or you can give up." I chose the challenge and the path. When people ask me how I have accomplished all the things that I have, I tell them that I do not let people get in my way! If you tell me I cannot do something it just makes want to do it just to prove them wrong. You also have to believe in yourself. I embrace my physical challenge and I believe in and accept who I am. The motto that I live by is "God made me beautiful, but my wheelchair makes me sexy." Embrace your challenge and who you are. You can be anyone you want to be if you just believe that you can do it.

Through DDSN, I have been put on a waiver that provides medical equipment as well as services for me to live on my own. If services like this did not exist I would not be able to reach my full potential. Believe in yourself and do not be afraid to ask for help. Your dreams will come true if you want them badly enough.


